But as it is hard to live in this world without money, working on a book, I will be grateful for any donations so I will be able to continue improving it and also be able to pay others who help me with it. I am only an architect coming with a suggested path to a world with happy and healthy people living as one with nature in absolute freedom.

The book should be seen as a beginning on a path to a healthy planet, where people will live happily and sustainably in true equality and true freedom - absolute freedom, a world without money - currencies or trading/barter. A world where everyone contributes with what each of us can - the only real solution to a healthy planet with healthy people.

I will not go in deeper to who I am, because it is not relevant. The book evolved through some years and my experiences both from a western perspective and a developing country perspective made me also be able to see if it would be possible to implement all over the world and I can only see more positive outcomes for people in what western countries see as poor countries.

History and modern times share a common thread: wars, tyranny, racism, injustice and inequality. Yet, while some movements spark local change, many leave the people no better off. We the people remain divided, fragmented, and weak—exactly as designed by the ones with the power and the money.

Most people on the earth are ruled by systems or more or less one system that uses divide and conquer to keep us in place and on top of that they give us a lot of distractions.

We are blinded and distracted by so many things that make us not be able to rethink and create a healthy world with healthy, thriving people.

The current systems of economic and social organization instead contribute to inequality, conflict, and environmental degradation. A paradigm shift is necessary to address the issues of greed, wars, and misery prevalent in the world today. We need to unite around one new solution or there will not be the change that is needed. Half of the world's wealth is now owned by the top 1% and hunger globally rose to as many as **828 million** in 2021.

We should all be born free. No land should belong to no one. Water, food and resources all come from the earth that we all share. No man should have the right to charge another man for anything. This is not the way of today - most of us are born, registered as a coming working force into the system, with a value put on us by governments. Many people struggle just to get enough money for basic food, clothes and shelter.

The current system wants us to be in debt to the banks. Be a customer of the big pharma corporations. Humans are being profited from and resources are being “stealed” from other regions/countries. There are wars going on over earth resources.

We have a lot of good technology to help us build a world where no human is beneath any other human, no one takes advantage of another human. A world where we all are free and we take care of each other and our planet, mother nature. Also believe it or not there will not be no need for 8 hours work days, 40 hours a week, for a whole life for any human if this solution can be implemented all over the world. More probably around 2 hours of contributions per day.

In this new world there will be no way to make money - therefore the best natural solutions can be brought to day. No big companies can no longer suppress competition. Because the only competition that will exist is coming up with the best solutions - both for humans and nature. Today, where there is no money to be made, the good solutions are being suppressed. For example Big Pharmacy companies don't find a better cure than antibiotics because there is no money to be made. Without profit the best solutions will be found.

Many are we, the people, that understand something has to be done on a global scale. Many are the people today that are active in smaller groups trying to make changes with good ideas. More and more people want to live in smaller communities growing their own food or living "off grid". More and more people feel that this system created is not for most of us, the people, at all.

This book is an imaginary thinking around what such a solution could look like. It is only a working start to make this transition as peacefully and calm as possible towards this new life for all humans and the planet. The rest will follow, with people working together, if we all can start our journey down this path. The journey needs to be started globally on the same day or it will not work - this is the hardest obstacle to overcome to make it happen.

As you understand it now - this is not a solution for one person, one family or a community to leave the system, because there are already many ideas out there on how to do that, hard to achieve for most of us and money will still be needed. The outcome for the people who succeed is that they still will be in the system, also depending on money in one way or another. That also doesn't lead to any improvements for all the rest of humanity.

Have you ever asked yourself? You didn't come to this earth to struggle to survive in times no one should need to struggle. You didn't come here to work a whole life just to only get a small amount of money - if any - to live out until death - which will come sooner or later for all of us. We are, to different degrees, experiencing hell in paradise, maybe not all the time, but from time to time. You did come here with nothing and all of us leave with nothing. We can't take anything with us when we leave this earth. Why shouldn't everything on earth be available to all people? No one should need to pay for living on land, eating food, drinking water or getting a roof over our heads.

In this new world we definitely are going to need more people contributing with work directly with the basic necessities for every human, because we will with time make better choices for everything involved and it will be more sustainable for the planet. Food, water, shelter, clothes, some work as a contribution. We need to share and help produce what we need.

This paradigm shift is not possible without most of the people on this earth onboard - there is commonly talked about a tipping point, you can read more about how many of us are needed to stand up or just sit down in peace for this cause, for a change to happen. I also added a text about this in the Extras chapter.

We just can't do it in small numbers. We need to stand together. This is the time for change.

Taking a step towards a paradigm shift away from ownership and towards alternative models of resource management and social organization is possible and very much needed. A world that promotes joy, love, health, laughter instead of keeping people struggling, unhealthy, sick, in fear, depressed or anxious etc.

The goal of absolute freedom will take place when the people said no as a collective. Then the rest will follow. The world will be changed on many different levels. For example all people today working with taking payment or giving our money as salary or support or working in banking system will need to at a start close the offices. They will find better, for them and the world things to do. The political level will no longer be needed, so all people

working with this will do the same. On the cultural level nothing needs to change at the start, it will automatically be improvements as we progress into this new world, people will have more time to exercise their culture they have in their area. As for the technological level nothing needs to be changed right in the start - we should absolutely use all good technological solutions that exist today, as long as it is not harmful and benefits all humans and does as little harm to nature as possible.

The thing is when people get absolute freedom - they go to their workplaces as before, sit down and talk to each other and think about if what the workplace does is something needed anymore in this new world. Is it not they can talk about if something can be used for good things in this world, or just leave it. For others the workplace can be transformed to an expert, planner and helper office. We are going to trust the people to work these things out.

When profit from others or the earth's resources is no longer possible, solutions that benefit everyone and our planet will emerge also eliminating the desire to create needs or issues to do profit.

Along the work with a possible way out some things cleared. As we are talking about absolute freedom, all lawbooks will be obsolete. Because of that we should agree on some basics, as few as possible, so 5 principles were chosen and 10 guidelines to live by. These together with some goals will be the part of the book that will stand on its own and will have a version attached to it. This part is a work in progress and as more people will contribute it can be changed. It should always be held short and easy to understand for all.

This book will not get into certain areas, for example our different religions, many of which already have their own writings on these things - they should be able to just continue to coexist in this new world just as it does coexist with today's lawbooks and power and money systems/structures.

United by this common cause, we the people will achieve wonders. This book sets the basics to act. The rest will follow as we walk this path. The clock is ticking - the time is running out.

5 first principles

- no money, no currencies will exist
- nothing will have a worth
- no barter or trading will exist
- no one nor any group, corporation or government will own nothing
- no one will have power over any other human being

From day one there will be positive changes for most people and other changes will naturally take time. Some people will have a harder time adjusting to this new world and some will have it easier. In the long run this will lead to healthier people on a healthy planet with all resources shared equally and where it's most needed.

Most of us will start out doing what we did yesterday. We all start out keeping what we are using today. All debts will go away as there is no need for them. The difference is that you will not get paid and you will not pay for anything.

Is your work no longer needed in this new world? Don't worry there will be many other fields where your unique qualities and contribution will be needed. There will be a transition towards many more people working closer to food production and covering the basic needs for humans.

Are you worried? So did you get food yesterday? You will get food today. Did you sleep in your bed yesterday? You will sleep in the same bed as long as you need.

No one owns nothing, but the things one human uses is for that human to use until he or she is done with it or shares it.

There will be no governments or rulers, no leaders nor bosses and no law books but there will be instead planners, experts and helpers. Many of these people already exist in today's working places. The planners take advice from experts if needed and plan what needs to be done and sometimes how. The difference is they will not and can not tell you or anyone to do it. This will be the planners and the experts' contribution to the world and without personal gain there is no incentive not to do good things for all humans and the planet.

10 guidelines

In this new world, there will be no law books. We will all live after the five principles and these ten basics. These guidelines emphasize ethical living, respect for others, and personal responsibility. There will be these principles and guidelines and no other. As mentioned above this part has a version attached, so it can after agreement from a group of editors be changed.

1. Do not idolize any human or created symbol.

2. Do not blindly follow others; instead, seek to make meaningful contributions.
3. Refrain from speaking ill of yourself or others, and avoid making unjust accusations.
4. Take time for rest and recuperation, acknowledging the importance of balance in life.
5. Show respect and gratitude to everyone and also your parents or those who have nurtured you.
6. Avoid violence and do not harm any living being or the natural world.
7. Remain faithful in your relationships, respecting the bonds of commitment.
8. Avoid taking what is in use by others and refrain from excessive accumulation of resources.
9. Speak truthfully and with integrity.
10. Avoid envy and respect what is in use by others.

Main goals

To have something to start with we keep working towards the main goals in the UN:s Agenda 2030. The goals in itself are amazing, I think we all can agree on most of them. To succeed in this new world we need to keep what is good and throw away what is no good. Everything can't be planned before the paradigm shift, things will need to come with time. The goals and specific how to solve them should be based on the principles and guidelines. This will be the difference from today - the solutions to how to reach the goals. The solutions in the new world **will not** take away people's freedom and will not be about controlling people, currency, land, resources, what to eat, how to be healthy and so on.

Several of the goals will be fulfilled on day one - as their first goal - No Poverty. As we all will "own" all the resources in the world. New solutions will emerge with time when this new world will be set.

- Basic needs **for all humans**, zero hunger, clean water, clean foods and sanitation
- **Freedom** - real freedom ex freedom of speech, freedom to choose, freedom to move
- **Equality** and **justice** - real equality - no one person is above or have power over no other person
- **Sustainability** on land and in oceans for all life
- Responsible Consumption and Production
- Good **health** and well being for all people and other living beings on the planet - start with taking away as many toxins as possible from our food, water and air.
- Education with quality, based on free will and to find each child's special gift, unique qualities, ability or interest.
- Decent "work" or contributions, the time we need to spend to contribute will lower drastically in this new world.
- **Peace** - end all war at day one and keep peace.

- Food production without any pesticides or other poison, animals that can walk free outside, smaller farms with more people contributing to the work and without any antibiotics or other harmful medicines.
- Industry - lower the need for industries down to an absolute need - many things are produced only to make profit today. Reuse, share and distribute to the ones in need.
- Innovations without the influence of profit.
- Infrastructure - with the land free it will be possible to work towards smaller communities and sustainable farming of land, oceans and living. Without someone making profit and/or profiting on people, industries that we still need, finally can be resource-efficient, environmentally friendly, and sustainable. See that all humans have access to necessary transportation, enough energy, and cabled internet nearby. Without the need for forced economic growth the decisions can be made for the people and the planet's best in interest.
- Energy - free and not pushed by agendas, first then, will it be possible to use solutions for the best of our planet and the people.
- Open all archives hidden to the people at day one.

How we will do it

This part of the book contains explanations on how we will do it in different areas from the start and forward. This will evolve as we advance in this new world. The most important thing here is to not implement any solutions that limit human freedom nor health. And with a world without money or trading/barter we finally have the possibility of doing just that, good solutions for both humans and nature!

A world built on sharing and contribution

In this new world, everyone contributes according to their ability and desire—about two hours of daily work/contribution, for more it is totally voluntary. Contribution is motivated by the whole gain of absolute freedom and everything free. It will not be overlooked by anybody. Planners and helpers will see so important functions always have contributors in place. There can also be other schedules or ways of sharing the work so that it feels more appealing doing it.

All resources and responsibilities are shared in this new world. Depending on what decisions that need to be taken it can be made by planners and experts. It can also be made locally in a neighbourhood or globally by different teams. When there is no money or power involved there will not be many decisions that need direct democracy or consensus.

We do not need to fully transfer to localized living—but producing only what is needed, reducing dependence on transport, and working towards regional self-sufficiency. There will be helpers, planners and experts in different regions also, that look into the decisions and

planning that need to be made on a bigger scale. Like a city, a county/district or country and so on and also globally. Like it works today in many countries, some instances that look at all railroads in the country for example. Also redistribution of knowledge and resources must be handled locally and globally - by different teams.

Nature and all living beings take priority. Land is not owned, but shared, with names kept only for orientation. Land is redistributed to bring people closer to nature and to support ecological, non-GMO food production. More small farms and boats, more hands in sustainable agriculture and fishing.

Locally produced, organic materials and food will become the norm. Transportation of resources to other countries will continue, where it is needed. Traditional skills like crafts and needlework are revived. Services like education, care, and infrastructure continues like today but good changes will come when there is no money involved - always remember - money didn't built any roads - people did, money didn't teach any knowledge - people did, money didn't write any books - people did, money didn't fix a broken leg - people did.

A new central IT-system spanning the globe using modern technology will help allocate resources based on need and availability with the help of AI. Products are designed for reuse, recycling, and minimal waste. Everything is shared and for free - things, knowledge, workforce and so on.

- **Voluntary Contribution:** 2 hours of essential daily work; additional efforts are voluntary.
- **Motivated by Purpose:** Work is driven by care and the will to contribute when everything is free.
- **Shared Resources:** No ownership and everyone's responsibility.
- **Decision-Making:** Can be done by planners and experts, globally or locally depending on what decision that is needed.
- **Decentralized Production:** If it benefits the people locally, globally and the nature it will be local productions, need-based.
- **Self-Sufficiency:** Each region works toward food and resource independence.
- **Nature First:** Land is shared, not owned; ecological harmony is a core value.
- **Sustainable Agriculture:** More small farms and fishermen; GMO-free, organic food.
- **Craft & Tradition:** Return of meaningful, practical skills.
- **Community Services:** Education, care, and infrastructure will in the beginning continue almost as today and are planned by experts, planners and helpers on different levels.

- **Tech for Good:** Centralized but fair resource allocation using current technology - globally.
- **Circular Design:** Products made to last, be reused, and create no waste.
- **Collaborative Innovation:** Experts from all fields over the world work together for systemic solutions.

The Role of Technology in a real Sustainable, Human - Nature Centered World

Automation and technology will be kept if it is benefitting people's well being and nature. As the contribution is only 2 hours, people will have a lot of time doing what they want. The most important thing is to create what people need, with nature and people's health as a priority.

We already have advanced technology in many parts of the world, the importance in this new world will be to see so the developing countries also get access to all this - see for example the problem with all plastics in the environment in many of these countries under the chapter "Extras".

Also much other infrastructure in these developing countries needs to be sought after as a priority in the beginning.

This new world will in itself allow individuals to focus on care, other people, nature, innovation, and personal growth.

Nothing should be automated at the expense of nature. As with this new world many of today's factories will not be needed and with more people contributing to the work, automation becomes less important.

Think all factory's making all this plastic shit that is not needed by anybody, but only for someone making money.... With that said we could absolutely continue making things that make a value in peoples life - for example sailing boats, skiing, footballs, pianos, computers but maybe we don't need 1500 different factories - also when things are free, they are also free to share.

Technology will be used only where it supports human well-being and protects the health of the planet. Solutions that contribute to sustainability, regenerate ecosystems, and serve basic human needs will be prioritized. In this new world we will reject technologies that are harmful. And as there is nothing to gain in not doing so all of this will automatically be solved.

Wireless technologies will be phased out for the benefit of all living beings, prioritizing long-term biological and ecological health over convenience, instead by time all will be wired internet.

In a world without money, barter, or economic competition, there will be no need for advertising, propaganda, or consumer-driven manipulation. Information will be shared transparently, and choices will be guided by well-being, not profit.

Advanced technologies like artificial intelligence and automation will help manage and distribute resources around the world fairly and efficiently. Also resources as knowledge, experts and work forces. It should be easy for people to go to other areas in the world to contribute with what they are interested in. Intelligent systems will anticipate needs, balance supply and demand, and support equitable access across the whole world.

In this new world there will be IT systems that enable easy sharing and collaboration, as there will be no ownership. Also the places where you get your things for free, as everything is free, you can also put it back when you no longer need it. Easy as pie - if you need a sewing machine you go to the store and pick it up and then return it when done, or just keep using it.

Environment

Without money as the driving force behind production and consumption, the world would naturally shift its focus toward sustainability, conservation, and the responsible use of natural resources. Overconsumption would give way to mindful living, with an emphasis on balance and ecological harmony.

A key priority would be restoring the health of the planet—reducing pollution and removing toxic substances that burden ecosystems and living beings. Harmful practices such as chemical spraying (e.g., geoengineering or "chemtrails") would be ended, in favor of nature-based, regenerative solutions that protect air, soil, and water quality.

Eliminating financial stress would lead to significant improvements in mental and emotional well-being. Freed from the pressure to earn and compete, people could focus more on happiness, relationships, health and creativity.

Land would be redistributed to support small-scale farming, ecological living, and a return to more traditional, harmonious ways of life. Health and Well-Being

In this new world health care would shift from reactive treatment to proactive, holistic well-being. The focus would be on identifying and addressing the root causes of illness, rather than merely treating symptoms. Natural remedies, nutrition, movement, mental balance, and connection with nature would be central to maintaining health.

Healthcare should also be made available and accessible to everyone in the world - prioritizing helping developing countries build this up.

Prevention would become the foundation of the health system, supported by hospitals, shared knowledge, and accessible healing practices. Modern science and traditional wisdom would work side by side to support the body's natural ability to heal.

As the pressures of financial survival disappear, cultural values would naturally evolve. Material wealth and consumerism would no longer define status or success. The massive resources, in form of people, work, deaths, weapons, currently devoted to warfare would be redirected toward healing the planet and get the developing countries to the same level as the other.

Traditional policing systems would be phased out, replaced by localized, trust-based conflict resolution methods. Small, trained local groups—formed from within—would address the rare breaches of core rules, always prioritizing restoration, understanding, and prevention over force or control.

Education for a Free and Evolving World

In a world free from monetary pressure, access to education and information would be open, free, and universally available, empowering everyone to engage in innovation, collaboration, and problem-solving.

Children would learn through hands-on, outdoor experiences, rooted in nature. Early education would emphasize practical skills, reading, critical thinking, and understanding the values of the new world — contribution, sustainability, and respect for all life.

In this new world everyone's basic needs will be met - food, shelter, healthcare, education. This will also strengthen the trust and connection between people and give a feeling of belonging. Transparent, participatory systems for conflict resolution and resource management would help maintain fairness and mutual respect.

By removing competition over survival and replacing it with sharing, this new world will have deep connections, shared responsibility, and a collective sense of well-being.

Equality and Stronger Communities
